Re: Comments on New Program Village of Groton

To whom it may concern:

The purpose of this letter is to submit comments on the Village of Groton's application to become a sponsor of an apprenticeship program for "Electrical (Outside) Line Worker". I submit this comment as the Business Manager for the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 1249.

It is Local 1249's position that the Department of Labor should not give approval for the Village of Groton to become a sponsor for this apprenticeship program. Electrical (Outside) Line Worker apprentices are *required* to receive minimum training in numerous distinctive work processes:

Given the size of this service area, the existing electric grid and infrastructure and the rate that this equipment and systems would, in a worst possible case scenario, need to be serviced and replaced, it would be *impossible* for these individuals to receive the 7,000 hours of necessary training in 42 months.

Local 1249 submits that the Department of Labor should review this with the applicant in detail prior to awarding the sponsorship. Please take this information we have provided into account when reviewing the qualifications of this proposed apprenticeship program. I am confident if you review this in detail you will reject this application. I fear awarding this entity a sponsorship will set a horrible precedent and, more importantly, could result in serious injuries and potentially fatalities. These entities can receive training through the MEUA without being a sponsor of this apprenticeship.
