Southern Tier Jobs

➤ In March 2024, there were 213,500 private sector jobs and 270,000 nonfarm (private + government) jobs in the region.

➤ Four industry sectors make up 72% of total nonfarm jobs:

Private Education & Health Services*	65,600
Government	56,500
Trade, Transportation & Utilities	41,200
Manufacturing	31,500


Job Gains

➤ The region gained 2,900 nonfarm jobs over the past year, including 1,000 private sector jobs and 1,900 government jobs.

➤ 3,000 of the recent job gains occurred in Government & Leisure and Hospitality.

Regional Industry Mix, March 2024










The State's unemployment rate (4.2%) is less than the region's unemployment rate (4.3%) by -0.1 percentage points.













Regional Labor Market Developments

Good news

Significant wastewater treatment system upgrades are planned in Chemung County thanks to over \$200 million in government funding. The county is expected to shutter one obsolescent treatment center and upgrade/modernize its other wastewater facility to handle all the county's clean water needs. The majority of the supportive funding is coming from the federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law with New York State bridging the project cost gap. According to Chemung County, its sewer districts serve more than 60,000 people.

Two affordable housing projects in Broome County have come closer to fruition thanks to \$24.6 million in New York State funding earmarked to ease low-cost housing shortages. Hooper Road Apartments in Endwell is in line to receive \$14.9 million, and Homesteads on Grand in Johnson City is expected to receive \$9.7 million. The two residential complexes are expected to add 152 new apartments to the Broome County housing stock.

Numerous construction projects are either in motion or are set to start at Binghamton University in Vestal (Broome County). A news report by WBNG TV states that plans include a new lecture hall, classroom and Teaching Chem Lab Building; renovations of the Science III Building for biology and the Fine Arts Building; and campus-wide maintenance. New York State has budgeted \$123 million to support the upgrades.
